This Byway travels through undeveloped wilderness area in the Pisgah National Forest, The Linville Falls, Caverns, present natural wonders, Grandfather Mountain, a natural landform and landmark, Picnic and hiking areas available all along the byway and sights of the Blue Ridge Mountains offer excellent photo opportunities.
