0.0	0.0	Start of Pacolet River Byway	At the Boundary line of North Carolina State with South Carolina, near the Junction Old Appalachian Highway and United States Highway #176, Starts Pacolet River Byway, Old railroad depots, log cabins and other historic buildings can be found in the towns of Saluda and Tryon, while Pearson Falls Natural Heritage Site, a 259 acre botanical wonderland where visitors can hike, bird watch or just enjoy the outdoors.
