0.0	0.0	Selma, Alabama	Selma, Alabama, a city located in Dallas County, Alabama, known for three Civil Rights Marches to Montgomery that started from here. Selma to Montgomery March Byway starts here on combined State Highway #22/2/8. Traveling this Byway is a journey through history that marks one of the major historic events in 20th Century American history, the 1965 Selma to Montgomery March, led by Martin Luther King, Jr. Selma boasts the state's largest historic district, over 1,250 structures. Excellent places to find the rich history of the city are Sturdivant Hall Museum, National Voting Rights Museum, Historic Water Avenue, Martin Luther King Jr. Street Historic Walking Tour, Old Depot Museum, Old Town Historic District, Vaughan-Smitherman Museum, Old Live Oak Cemetery and the Heritage Village. The arts and museums of the city include the Mira's Avon Fan Club House, Performing Arts Centre, and the Selma Art Guild Gallery. Some of the local attractions are the Paul M.
