Batoche displays the remains of the village of Batoche on the banks of the South Saskatchewan River. It was the last battlefield in the Northwest Rebellion of 1885. Louis Riel selected Batoche as the headquarters of his 'Provisional Government of Saskatchewan'. Several buildings have been restored within the site. The site depicts the lifestyles of the Mā̃tis of Batoche between 1860 and 1900 - the trails they walked, their homes, their church, and the Battle of Batoche, May 9-12, 1885.	41.6	67.0

Duck Lake, SK, is in the center of an area great in historical importance. Within a few minutes drive from Town a person can visit the site of the Battle of Batoche, the site of the Battle of Duck Lake, the site of the Duck Lake Massacre, Fort Carlton, SK, a buffalo jump, the St. Laurent Shrine and the Seager Wheeler Farm.	30.4	49.0

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46.0	74.0	Junction of Highway 212 west,	West access to Fort Carlton Provincial Park, SK. - Situated on the Carlton Trail from the Red River Settlement in present-day Manitoba to Fort Edmonton in what is now Alberta, Fort Carlton served as a hub for travellers. It is located along the North Saskatchewan River. - Fort Carlton Provincial Park takes you back in time to the days of the fur trade before Canada was a country. This is the original site of a Hudsonâ€™s Bay Company fur-trading post that operated between 1810 and 1885. You will see a reconstructed palisade, fur and provisions store, trade store, clerkâ€™s quarters, and tepee encampment; each of these appears much like they would have in the late 1800s.
