Two campgrounds are located within the eastern portion of our park. There is a total of 92 campsites, 26 of which offer electrical service. The campsites are roomy enough for RVs or that extra tent for the kids! Camping is operated on a self-registration system. The Elmview Campground possesses a modern service centre with free showers and 26 electrified sites. Seasonal campsites are also available at Elmview.
