The river flows into several other lakes of significance in southeast Saskatchewan, including: Buffalo Pound Lake, SK, to the northwest of Regina, SK, created by damming the Qu'Appelle River in 1956, which supplies water to Regina, SK, Moose Jaw, SK, the four Fishing Lakes (Pasqua, Echo, Mission, and Katepwa Lakes) to the northeast of Regina; and, farther downstream, to the north of Grenfell, SK and Broadview, SK: Crooked Lake and Round Lake.	30.1	48.4

Both campgrounds have a service centre with hot showers and access to modern, barrier-free washrooms as well as non-modern facilities. Lakeview campground is on the south side of Echo Lake and has a trailer section with 23 electrical sites and a tenting area with 64 non-electrical ones. Lakeview offers modern, non-modern and barrier-free washroom facilities. There are several group-camping areas in the park.
