0.0	0.0	Georgia-North Carolina Border	Entering Union County, Georgia -- 204,736 acres of which about half are within the Chattahoochee National Forest -- in the Appalachian Mountains. Attraction in Union County include: Union County Historical Courthouse Museum, Blairsville, GA. Blood Mountain Archaeological Area, Brasstown Bald Mountain & Visitor Information Center, Byron Herbert Reece Home place, Cooper's Creek Scenic & Recreation Area, DeSoto Falls Scenic Area, Dukes Creek Falls, Frank Gross Recreation Area, Helton Creek Falls, Horse Trough Falls, Lake Nottely, Lake Winfield Scott, Lake Woody, Richard Russell Scenic Highway, Sosebee Cove Scenic Area, Trackrock Archaeological Area, Vogel State Park, Woody Gap Recreational Area.	42.2	67.9

Go East to Towns County, Young Harris, Hiwassee and Georgia Mountain Fair.--Attractions in Blairsville, GA - The Historical Courthouse & Museum are the cornerstone of Town Square. Downtown Blairsville events include the Mountain Gospel Convention and Spring Arts & Crafts Festival in May and the SouthEastern Bluegrass Association Festival in September. A block from Town Square is the Historical Society's Mountain Life Museum with its Labor Day Heritage Marketplace Festival. A mile from Downtown Blairsville is Butternut Creek Golf Course and Meeks Park which hosts Blairsville's Scottish Festival and Highland Games in June, Butternut Creek Arts Festival in July, and Georgia's official Sorghum Festival in October. In the southern tip of Union County is Georgia's highest community, Suches in the Valley Above the Clouds with its Indian Summer Festival in October.	31.7	51.0
