Kings Castle, a day use park, is a magical place displaying a family of favourite storybook characters in statue form. | 21.0 | 33.8 | Northumberland PEI, Provincial Park                          | South side of highway. Northumberland Provincial Park is on Route 4, 3 km east of the Wood Islands ferry. It is open from mid June to mid September and offers a lifeguarded ocean beach, clam digging, laundromat, hot showers (4), flush toilets (9), playground, kitchen shelter, forest trail, children's programs and a dumping station.
