1.0	1.6	West Coyote Creek grottoes	A short piece of an old county road, angling southwest, leads to some small but interesting grottoes in the drainage at the ford and a small dugout nearby.	20.7	33.3
2.1	3.4	San Juan County Road 182	Graded off-highway vehicle road to the right providing access to an abandoned uranium strip mine (about 2.5 miles) and several 4-wheel drive trails in the Cameo Cliffs, Utah Recreation Area.	19.6	31.5
5.4	8.7	Highline Road	Graded off-highway vehicle road traveling around the base of the La Sal Mountains and crossing the drainages of Buck Hollow, Cottonwood Canyon and Black Canyon. After about 11 miles Highline Road connects with Black Ridge Road which joins US Highway 191 about 9.5 miles south of Moab, Utah. Numerous 4-wheel drive trails spur upward toward the mountains.	16.3	26.2

13.2	21.2	Old La Sal, Utah	Was first settled in 1877. It was abandoned in 1930 when the present townsite of La Sal (see milemarker 8.9) was firmly established.	8.5	13.7
