0.0	0.0	Stamford VT	Vermont State Route 100 begins its northward path here and bisects the state from its bottom at the Massachusetts border to its top just a bit short of the Canadian border. Route 100 is a continuation of Massachusetts Route 8 which runs north from the town of North Adams. This two lane road meanders a little over 200 miles through some of the most beautiful and peaceful countryside in the world. It is one of the longest and most scenic drives you will ever see. I hope you have the opportunity to see it all.	220.6	355.0
0.2	0.3	Sully's Driving Range	West side. If you have been traveling for a while, here's a good place to stretch and hit some golf balls. Sully's field is sometimes home to a flock of Canada geese. The photo is of a small barn with American flag located across the street. You will see a large number of America flags along Route 100. You could create a travel game by counting the number of flags you see.	220.4	354.7
0.8	1.3	Stone Lions	The lions are in the front yard of a beautiful home and farm on the west side. The village of Stamford is home to three churches, two of them good examples of classic New England church architecture. You will see as many churches as American flags along Route 100!	219.8	353.7

8.1	13.0	VT State Route 8	Route 8 continues straight north while Route 100 begins to turn southeast. Route 8 is a scenic drive with some nice views.	212.5	342.0
9.4	15.1	River on south side	You will begin to see the Deerfield River, Vermont on the south side of the road, running parallel to the road. Such rock and boulder-filled waterways will become common sights on your Route 100 journey.	211.2	339.9
10.9	17.5	Pull off	On the south side of the road is a pull-off where you can get out and see the river. If you brought your fishing rod, give it a try (but don't forget to get your VT fishing license - available at many stores and shops). And it's OK to do some hot weather wading too but stay away in the spring - these rivers run high and fast, and are quite dangerous.	209.7	337.5
12.8	20.6	Readsboro, Vermont	General store and gas. Route 100 begins to climb a long hill through a forest and then opens to roadside farms and marshes before heading back down into the next valley.	207.8	334.4
17.3	27.8	Whitingham, Vermont	There's a nice lake to the north just as you pass the Whitingham town line. The town is not much to look at but the surrounding countryside is very picturesque.	203.3	327.2
18.2	29.3	Brigham Young Birthplace	The famous leader of the Mormons was born here. There is a marker on the road noting that he was born on Stimpson Hill Road but our side trip up that road did not reveal the location. Ask one of the locals if you are interested in finding it.	202.4	325.7
18.6	29.9	Brigham Young Monument, Vermont	Turn south on Sadawga Lake Road. There is a sign on the right pointing the direction to the monument. However, we were unable to locate it. You will come to some country road intersections with no more clues on where the monument is. About 8/10ths of a mile up Sadawga Lake Rd., at the Poverty Road intersection, is a very nice looking inn called the Whittingham Inn. It is high on a hill and has magnificent views to the north, overlooking horse meadows, a valley and mountains in the distance.	202.0	325.1
20.1	32.3	Sugar house	On the south side of the road is a sugar house where maple sap is brought in the early Spring and boiled down to maple syrup. If you drive by at that time of year and see great clouds of white smoke, don't stop to call the fire dept! It's just steam from the evaporators. Sugar houses have the large and distinctive cupolas on top to release the steam.	200.5	322.7

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21.6	34.8	Sap lines	You may see plastic pipes running from tree to tree alongside the road. These pipes are the modern method of collecting sap and have replaced the galvanized buckets at commercial maple syrup operations (but some small operators and hobbyists still use buckets). These pipes lead to the stainless steel or plastic tanks you may see. The tanks are picked up by truck and taken to the sugar house. It's a labor intensive business but a strong tradition in Vermont.	199.0	320.2
21.9	35.2	Jacksonville General Store	Route 100 takes a 90 degree turn to the north here and begins a climb out of the valley. Marillas Antiques on the south side is a pretty good store. It has a small deck out back overlooking a stream with step-down water falls where you can think about whether or not to purchase that special item you just saw inside. (Route 112 and 8A go right and head south to Massachusetts.)	198.7	319.8
23.4	37.7	Sprague and Sons (and grandsons, and great grandsons, etc)	Six generations of Spragues have been farming this area and running sugaring operations. That's not an uncommon number in Vermont.	197.2	317.3
27.5	44.3	Route 9 Intersection	The Vermont Liquor Outlet occupies what was once a huge sugarhouse with massive stone fireplace for visitors. It is a classic post and beam construction but unfortunately no longer is used for its original purpose. Averill Stand, a 200 year old inn, is on the opposite side of the intersection. Organic farm produce is big business in Vermont and you can find such goods at Elain's Market about 100 yards down Route 9 from the intersection. On Route 100 just past the intersection is an Antique and Flea Market open weekends from mid-May to mid Oct.	193.1	310.7
27.9	44.9	White Horse Inn	On the east side just as you start down a hill. A nice looking facility, AAA rated, and a good vista from its hilltop location.	192.7	310.1
28.1	45.2	Wilmington, Vermont	You are on the outskirts of Wilmington, Vermont. Routes 100 and 9 are running together here. A tenth of a mile farther, the Viking Motel is on the east side of the road. There are plenty of restaurants, gas stations, and other conveniences in the area.	192.5	309.8
28.7	46.2	Stop Light in Wilmington, Vermont	There probably aren't a dozen stop lights along Route 100 in the entire state but this town's narrow streets can get congested with summer and fall tourists and winter skiers so a light was a necessity. Route 9 goes straight east and Route 100 turns north. If you go straight on Route 9 for a tenth of a mile, you will see the Chamber of Commerce office on the right. It is an excellent source for travel information. Also, there are several very fine inns and restaurants, as well as quaint shops, in the same area. The best thing to do in this town is to find a place to park and simply walk up and down the street - it's a small town and easily covered on foot.	191.9	308.8

You can find it by turning east, going past the Inn at Waters Edge, continuing a few minutes and then turning left onto Scout Camp Road. This is a great detour that will be well worth the 45 minutes or so that it takes to drive to the top and then retrace your steps back to Route 100. On the left is Mad River Green shopping center with bank and ATM, post office, hardware store, etc. The shopping center is also the site of the Waitsfield Farmers market on Saturday mornings May through October.
