Waterbury Reservoir, VT. 830 acres, is very popular for boating and fishing activities as is the Little river, which flows from the Reservoir to the Winooski River Facilities: Little River State Park, which is part of Mt. Mansfield, VT. State Forest, primarily consists of a campground with 81 tent/trailer sites and 20 lean-tos. This is central Vermont's largest and most popular campground. Three of the four restrooms include hot showers (\$). A sanitary dump station is available, but no hookups. The day use area has 75 shaded picnic sites with tables and hibachis. All rest rooms have lavatories and flush toilets. There is 200 feet of beach and swimming area. Stillwater State Park.
