Camping Pattison has 59 regular (family) campsites, 18 of them with electric hookups, and three backpack sites.</p> <p>There is a sanitary dumping station but no sewer or water hookups. Showers and flush toilets are available during the summer. Attractions in and around Duluth, WI, The Lake Superior Maritime Visitor Center. This museum features maritime exhibits showing the commercial ships of Lake Superior and the Duluth-Superior Harbor. - Lake Superior Railroad Museum</p> <p>Duluth, WI. This museum features the early history of Wisconsin and Minnesota railroading. They have on site steam engines unique to the area. - S.S. William A. Irvin Ore Boat Museum</p> <p>Duluth, MN This ore carrying ship is a floating museum, the boat is docked along the Duluth waterfront. Also along side is a historic tugboat 'The Lake Superior'. - Tweed Museum of Art</p> <p>Duluth, MN The museum shows collections of American and European paintings. - St. Louis County Heritage &amp; Arts Center, ' The Depot' Duluth, MN.
