1.4	2.3	Exit 5	Junction of Highway #4 North to city of Dover. Access to Highway #1 to communities of Newstle and Kittery - East side of the highway. Junction of Highway #4 North to cities of Dover and Rochester. Junction of Highway #16 North to Ossipee, Conway and Berlin. Access to Odiome Point State Park and Wallis Sands State Beach - East of the highway. Note: Highways #4 and #16 North called the 'Spaulding Turnpike' at this point. The Spaulding Turnpike is eastern New Hampshire's major limited access North-South highway linking the Seacoast area and I-95 with Concord via US 4 and with the Lakes Region and White Mountains via NH 16.	18.0	28.9
1.4	2.3	Junction of Highway #4	North to the city of Dover. Dover has a long and colorful history spanning nearly four centuries. Its earliest days as a colonial seaport led to a successful shipbuilding industry in the 1700s.	18.0	28.9
1.4	2.3	Access to Odiorne Point State Park & Wallis Sands State Beach	Picnickers can enjoy sweeping views of the ocean and rocky shore. Amenities offered include picnic tables, a boat launch, restrooms, a paved bicycle path, interpretive displays. Wallis Sands State Beach offers oceanfront swimming, views of the Isles of Shoals. Beach amenities include a store, bathhouses, hot and cold showers.	18.0	28.9
2.2	3.5	Exit 4	Note: I-95 called the 'Blue Star Turnpike' at this point. The Blue Star Turnpike segment of the Turnpike System extends from the Massachusetts state line in Seabrook to the Portsmouth Traffic Circle in Portsmouth. It is 15.0 miles in length and constitutes a portion of I-95. It also parallels the seacoast and, as such, is the major artery for tourist traffic to the New Hampshire coast.	17.2	27.7

9.5	15.3	Junction of Highway #101	Access to the Jenness State Beach and Rye Harbor State Park - East of the highway. Jenness State Beach. Amenities at the beach include a bathhouse. Rye Harbor State Park affords scenic views of the Atlantic Ocean and Rye Harbor, also called Ragged Neck. Amenities offered; picnic tables and restrooms.	9.9	15.9
