0.0	Exit #211 Junction of Highway # 1 & # 114	West to town of Sussex, NB. South to Fundy National Park with campgrounds, community of Alma, NB, Hopewell Rocks, NB. - Attractions in Sussex, NB. - The Kings County Agricultural Museum - Sussex Murals - The Atlantic Balloon Fiesta - Kings County Agricultural Fair - N.B. Antique Auto Club Inc. Giant Flea Market.

3.5	Goshen Road	Access to Kennebecasis River, NB; covered bridge. Goshen Road for 7.2 km 4.4 mi.). Built in 1911. Length 17.7m (58')

13.9	Fundy National Park ( Northern Boundry )	Fundy National Park of Canada encompasses some of the last remaining wilderness in southern New Brunswick. Picnic areas are found all through the park. Some locations also provide shelters and washroom facilities.
14.2	Wolf Lake, Fundy National Park Picnic Site	Access from highway. Access to Point Wolfe Campground - semi-wooded campground with unserviced sites. Facilities; hiking trails, kitchen shelters, showers, flush toilets and fire pits.
14.4	Fundy National Park Information Centre	At highway
16.2	East Branch Fundy National Park	East Branch Hiking Trail in Fundy National Park is a 5.6 km (3.5 miles) loop hiking trail through forest area.
18.6	Bennett Lake Fundy National Park	Swimming, picnic area
19.8	Caribou Plain Fundy National Park, NB	Hiking trail, west side of highway. Caribou Plain Hiking Trail in Fundy National Park is a 3.4 km loop (2 miles) wooded hiking trail.
20.4	Point of Interest	Height of land in Funday National Park, 366 mtrs
22.7	Point of Interest	Crossing Kinnie Brook, Fundy National Park
23.3	Kinnie Brook Hiking Trail - Fundy National Park	Access to picnic area. Kinnie Brook Hiking Trail Round Trip Length: 1.8 miles This hike takes you through a steep valley with a lush forest and a disappearing stream.
24.0	Chignecto Campground	East of highway. Chignecto North Campground - wooded campground with serviced and unserviced sites. Facilities: bicycle trails, showers, kitchen shelters, flush toilets, fireplaces, playground, dumping station, wheelchair accessible sites.
25.5	Fundy Highlands Chalets	East side of highway
26.1	Fundy Park Chalets, Seawinds Resturant	Access from highway
26.2	Visitor Information Station	At Highway
26.5	Roadside Highway Turnout	Look out area
26.7	Photo	View from highway. Alma Beach, NB; at low tide.
26.8	Point of Interest	East Fundy National Park boundry
26.9	Point of Interest	Crossing Upper Salmon River, NB.
27.0	Village of Alma, NB.	All services. The Village of Alma, NB was established in 1856. Alma is close to the Bay of Fundy, it is considered by locals to be the 'Home of the Highest Tides in the World.
27.0	Photo	View from highway, outgoing tide, village of Alma New Brunswick

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27.5	Junction of Highway #915	Access to communities of Waterside, NB, Cape Enrage, NB. NOTE The Fundy Coastal Drive follows highway # 915 for 30 km's then joining back again, with highway #114. Attractions at Cape Enrage, NB. Cape Enrage Lighthouse is the oldest lighthouse on the New Brunswick Mainland.
34.4	Bennis Beach Road	South to community of Waterside, NB.
35.5	Community of Germantown, NB	East side of highway
35.7	Point of Interest	Crossing the West River, NB.
35.9	Roadside Highway Turnout with Information sign	Access from highway
36.5	Road access to covered bridge	South of highway SHEPODY RIVER #3 (Germantown Lake) Between Riverside-Albert and Alma on Midway Road, off Rte. 114, at Germantown. Built in 1903. Length 18.6m (61')
40.3	Photo	View from highway
43.1	Junction of Highway #915	NOTE The Fundy Coastal Drive follows highway # 915 for 30 km's then joining back again, with highway #114. South to communities of Derrys Corner, NB, Harvey, NB. North to communities of Riverside-Albert, NB, Albert, NB. Information center. Across from information centre is a Lions Club picnic and campground.
46.5	Point of Interest	Access to covered bridge, south of highway. SAWMILL CREEK #0.5 Near Riverside-Albert at Hopewell Hill alongside of Rte. 114. (Not in Service) Built in 1905. Length 32.5m (104' 6')
48.1	Community of Shepody, NB	South of highway
53.1	Ponderosa Pines Campground	Access from highway
53.1	Photo Hopewell Rocks New Brunswick, tidel marsh.	Photo of west portion of Hopewell Rocks New Brunswick, tidel marsh. There are trails from campground to hike over to the Hopewell Rocks. Check TIDE Table at campground office.
53.1	Photo - Looking at Hopewell Rocks, NB.	West portion of Hopewell Rocks (incoming tide)
53.1	Photo - Looking at the Hopewell Rocks, NB.	West portion Hopewell Rocks (incoming tide)
53.8	Community of Hopewell Cape, NB.	West side of highway. Around Hopewell Cape, NB; are the highest tides in the world.

54.1	Hopewell Rocks Ocean Tidal Exploration Site, NB	East of highway.
54.5	Services at Highway	North side of highway
55.6	Albert County Museum, NB	North side of highway. The Museums collection contains numerous artifacts collected from the industry and families of the area.
58.5	Gaskins Chocolate River Campgrounds, NB	East side of highway

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61.7	Community of Hillsborough, NB	East of highway. Attractions in Hillsborough, NB. - New Brunswick Railway Museum. The museum is a leading railway museum in New Brunswick and houses an extensive collection of railway artefacts. - Another attraction in Hillsborough - Heritage Hillsborough Inc & Steeves House Museum. Steeves House Museum is the birthplace of William H. Steeves, Father of Confederation. The House is filled with artifacts from the period of 1840 to 1890.
62.6	Services at Highway	Gas, diesel, east side of highway
63.1	Junction of Highway #910 (Salem Road)	West to community of Salem, NB.
70.5	Services at Highway	East side of highway
73.6	Town of Riverview, NB	South limits, all services. Riverview, NB is located on the south side of the Petitcodiac River, NB
75.7	Roadside Highway Turnout Rest Area with Information Centre	Picnic tables, toilets. East side of highway
76.9	Roadside Highway Turnout	West side of highway
78.0	Point of Interest	Crossing the Peticodiac River, NB. This river because of its colour, it is often nicknamed the 'Chocolate River'. The river is 129 km long.
78.4	Junction of Highways #106 & #15	City of Moncton, NB. North to downtown Moncton. South to village of Alma, NB, Fundy National Park, Sussex, NB. East to town of Sackville, province of Nova Scotia. Attractions in and around Moncton, NB. Magnetic Hill - Magic Mountain - Moncton Museum - Thomas Williams House - Free Meeting House, a National Historic site - Marche Moncton Market - Magnetic Hill Zoo.
