0.0	City of Albuquerque, New Mexico	Junction of Interstate #25. Albuquerque nestled between the towering Sandia Mountains and the Rio Grande Valley, the city of Albuquerque is rich with culture and heritage. Attractions in Albuquerque: Albuquerque Aquarium,- Alvarado Transportation Center - Beach Water Park - Cliff's Amusement Park - New Mexico State Fair - Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta - Lodestar Astronomy Center - National Atom Museum - City of Albuquerque, Old Town Plaza - Rio Grande Botanical Gardens - Sandia Crest and Sandia Peak Aerial Tramway.
0.9	Exit #158	Access to Indian Pueblo Cultural Center Museum. The Indian Pueblo Cultural Center in Albuquerque provides valuable insight into Pueblo culture, art and history. The center houses two museums and several gift shops.
2.2	Exit #157A (Rio Grande Blvd)	Access to historical town. Old Town is the heart of Albuquerque's long and rich history and heritage. The first families settled near the banks of the Rio Grande River in 1706. Originally, Albuquerque was a colonial farming village and a military outpost along the Camino Real between Chihuahua, Mexico and Santa Fe.
3.5	Point of Information	Crossing the Rio Grande. The Rio Grande Wild and Scenic River, or El Rio Bravo del Norte, provides protection and maintenance of the pristine character of the Rio Grande from the Coahuila/Chihuahua, Mexico, state border upstream from Mariscal Canyon to the Terrell/Val Verde County line in Texas downstream.

In New Mexico, Route 66 slices across the entire state, from border to border.

62.1	Exit #96	South to communities of McCartys, New Mexico, Acoma, New Mexico,. Acoma, known as 'Sky City.' Acoma Pueblo was built several hundred years ago on top of a 367-ft sandstone mesa. This strategic location made it an effective defense against attackers. It is considered to be the oldest inhabited village in the United States.

69.2	Exit #89 - Junction of Highway #117.	South to communities of Trechado, New Mexico, Quemado, New Mexico. Services, fuel, off highway. Access to El Malpais National Conservation area. El Malpais means 'the badlands'. Volcanic features such as lava flows, cinder cones, pressure ridges and complex lava tube systems dominate the landscape.

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76.6	Exit #81	City of Grants. Access to business route #40. Junction of Highway #53. Access to Roadways #122, #40. South access to Bandera Volcano and Ice Caves; Cooling underground airflow maintains a perpetual mass of ice. Nearby, Bandera Crater offers a glimpse of how one of New Mexico's many volcanoes erupted. South access to El Morro National Monument. This famous inscription rock displays names, messages, and petroglyph dating back as far as nine centuries. Don Juan de Onate, founder of New Mexico's first permanent Spanish colony, and soldiers and settlers have all left there marks here. Atop this mesa, you can explore ancient ruins. South to communities of El Morro, New Mexico, Pescado Black Rock.
79.2	Exit #79	Access to business Route #40. Junctions of Highway #605. North to communities of Milan, San Mateo, Ambrosia Lake. Access to state police, R.V. parks, campgrounds. Services off highway, fuel. Access to Chaco Cultural National Historical Park. When Anasazi, or 'Ancient Ones,' settled this area over a thousand years ago, it grew to become one of the largest cities in North America. Once home to over 40 ceremonial kivas and a 600-room hemispherical communal dwelling, Chaco Canyon transports you back in time.
